After the building was completed, the State Women's Missionary Union bought the pews for the church for a total of seven hundred and nineteen-collars and sixty cents from Clear Creck Funiture Factory in Pineville. The pulpit was purchased by Bro. George Parrett from his selling of a dollar gold piece and an old dime.
