Livesteck Compensation Program (LCP) The Agricultural Assistance Act of 2003 extended the Livestock Compensation Program (LCP), originally created in 2002, into 2003. The same entergency initiative administered by the Farm Service administer

for LCP.

To be eligible, a producer's livestock operation headquarters must be physically located in a county with a qualifying dissert designation. Eligible livestock are livestock owned or cash leased on or before June 1, 2002 and have been owned or cash leased for a minimum of 90 calendar days and include cattle, sheep, goats

and buffalo as well as catfish.
