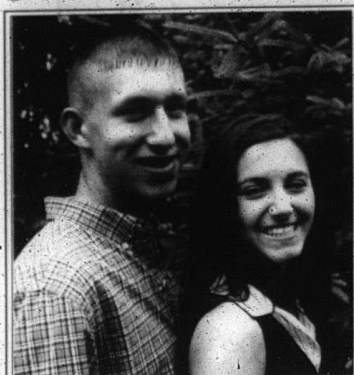

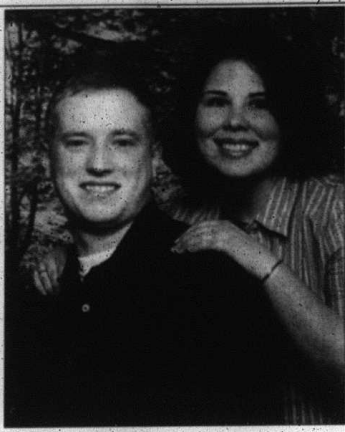

"It is Written"

I was talked to a fellow one time, and he made the comment that years ago he used to drink, but certainly wouldn't do it now; which is commendable. What was interesting was his comment about booze, he said "I didn't like it, but I drunk it for the effect." Honesty, so refreshing! I think if the truth was known, a whole bunch of people would have to admit that the reason they drink is for the effect.

The effect of booze is known by all, to become intoxicated. But a child of God serious about serving God, does not desire, nor want to be under the influence of alcohol. Peter said in 1 Peter 4:2-4, "That he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God. For the time past of our life may suffice us to have wrought the will of the Gentiles, when we walked in lasciviousness, lusts, excess of wine, revellings, banquetings, and abominable idolatries: Wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, speaking evil of you." Peter said we have wasted enough time, doing the will of the Gentiles, which he said includes, excess of wine, revellings, and banquetings, which is the evil use of alcohol, drinking it for the effect. Whether or not one drinks a bunch, or enough to get half-looped, or just drinking a "couple of beers", the end goal is to feel "the effect." Some folks claim they like the taste of booze (that's hard to believe, though I guess you could acquire a taste for it) as if that was the reason they drink the stuff. But you can get stuff without the alcohol in it. No, I think the above admission is the real reason why the majority of folks drink booze. It's not for the taste, or to quench the thirst, but for "the effect."
