The crime spree began shortly before 3 p.m. Sunday when Hampton rin his own vehicle into a ditch on Cemetery Road near Waynesburg.
According to police reports. Hampton grabed a rifle out of his vehicle and stopped a car belonging to Rene P. Rodriguez of Tolley Road, Waynesburg.

Rodriguez and a passenger,
Donacino Gonzalez of Danville out of the car at gunpoint and robbed Gonzalez of \$200 in cash.

As the three stood on the road, a pickup truck belonging to Shelby and Lucille Justice of Tolley Road hap-pened by. Gonzalez jumped in the back of the pickup and told the Jus-tices to "fly," which they did. Hampton gave chase in Rodriguez's car but didn't catch them.

Hampton was arrested and police say further arrests may be made. Hampton was on probation from jail after entering guilty pleas in two separate cases in the past seven

months.

He pleaded guilty in November to wanton endangerment charges for shooting at an occupied house last

March. He was sentenced to two years in prison but the sentence was probasted for three years. Earlier this year, he pleased guilty to charges that he held a kinfe to is ea-wife's threat and threatened to beat her or kill her over custedy of their child. He was sentenced to 30 days in jail. That softence also was probated.

Hampton, whose lives at 930 Ellison Rd., Waynesburg, was about to have his probation revoked for not attending drug treatment classes, refusing to submit to drug tests and fail-

ing to report to his probation officer. Circuit Judge William Cain last month ordered his probation revoked

month ordered his probation revoked but police had not located Hampton until finding him at a house on Ellison-Pulaski Road shortly after 7, p.m. Sunday after the alleged car theft and attempted robberies. Thus far. Hampton has been charged with two counts of robbery, theft of the car and tampering with evidence in the burning of the stolen

car.
