The Rockcastle County Fiscal Court volted Jast Friday to contribute \$13,400 in matching funds for a \$120,600 FEMA grant received by the Brindle Ridge Five Department. Federal Funds announced for Western Rockcastle Water

The Western Rockcastle Water Association, Inc. received a \$125,000 loan and \$125,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Development mission area, an-nounced Senator Jim Bunning re-

nounced Senator Jim Bunning re-cently.

"The USDA Rural Development funds, along with a \$25,000 Acc grant and \$12,000 borrower, contri-bution, will be used to construct ap-proximately 10 miles of waterlines, upgrade over a mile of existing wa-terlines and a pressure reducing sta-tion and replace an existing creek crossing," said Senator Bunning. "This project will benefit 48 new us-ers and improve service to 3,991 custing users in rural Rockessile County and portions of Pulsaki, Lincoln and Garrand Counties."
