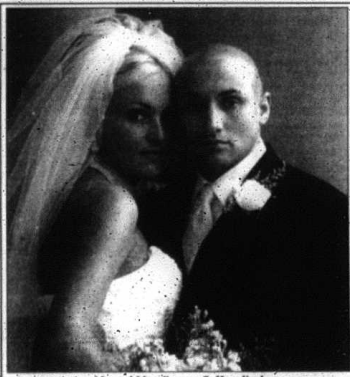

Tracey Flynn was the maid of honor and Naji Hamdiyah served as best man.

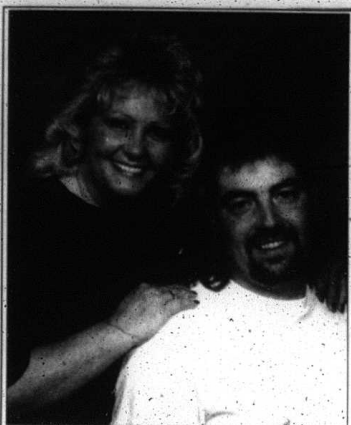
Bridesmaids were Windy McLaughley, Marie Carter and Chelsey Reynolds. Groomsmen were

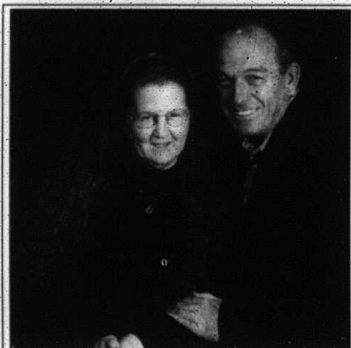

40th Wedding Anniversary

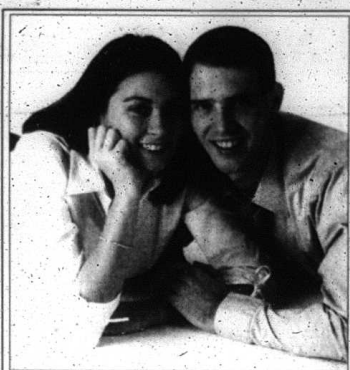
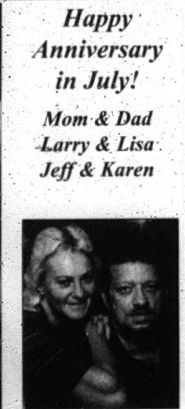

"It is Written"

In Col 3:10-11 we read, "And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him. Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond nor free: but Christ is all, and in all." Again in Gal 3:29, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus." There is a powerful truth taught in these verses, that all barriers that so often divide men are tore down in Christ Jesus.
