On February 20, 2003. the Agricultural Assistance Act of 2003 (the ACT), was signed into law. The ACT provides for Crop Disaster Program (CDP) for losses because of weather-related disasters to agricultural commodifies in crop year 2001 and 2002.
Producers filing for losses must provide production evidence or records to substantiate, the 35% loss of the crop. Debacco and posture are not eligible under CDP. 
