who keep the records, freely admit that is poor and incomplete. Clearly there is a problem here. But, completely aside from this record, it is

virtually certain that the simple possession of old remains is not even a violation under the law. The Game Wardens must have credible external evidence to prove it was taken illegally. This is not a situation of having a freshly-killed carcass hanging from a tree in your hunting camp. I am

speaking of animals which were taken years, even decades, ago. The Game Wardens then are issuing citations for (alleged) hunting activities of the distant past. This is not at all consistent with the laws governing their enforcement jurisdiction.

The Game Wardens are violating the law by entering people's homes without due process. They are misinterpreting the law by issuing citations without proper evidence or belief of wrongdoing. They are performing illegal seizures. They are treating people with disrespect and demonstrating contempt for the American justice system. They are, in effect, extorting citizens of their money and possessions. It is an outrage and should not be allowed to continue.

20 miles north of Charleston and 15 miles south of Ripley, Culp, who was in her mid-50s, took the helm of the London hospital at Easter 2002 following a month-long search to replace long-time administrator Lowell Jones.

A native of Panama City, Florida, Culp began working at the 350-bed St. Joseph's Hospital after graduating from the Medical College of Georgia. She worked her way up to chief operating officer over a 31-year period before accepting the job in London.

Both Marymount and St. Joseph's are owned by Catholic Health Initiatives, a not-for-profit health care organization, comprised of hospitals and long-term care facilities in 19 states.

According to a Kentucky State Police news release, on Friday afternoon, Whitley County dispatch received a report from the Jellico (Tenn.) police department about a gray 2000 Chevrolet Corvette which had driven off a ramp at a gas station without paying for the gas.

Whitley Co. Constable Will Leach saw the vehicle traveling north on I-75 and attempted to stop the vehicle, with the assistance of the Williamsburg City Police and Whitley County Sheriff's Department. The driver began to evade officers by driving at a high rate of speed and eventually the vehicle was lost by pursuing officers near exit 25, Corbin. A description of the vehicle was given to agencies in the area and, at approximately 4 p.m., KSP Troopers Tommy Cromer and Coby Smith observed the vehicle on US 25 in Rockcastle County.

As officers attempted to stop the vehicle, the driver again attempted to elude officers by turning onto KY 1004, approximately 2 miles south of Mt. Vernon in Rockcastle County. The driver was apprehended after a short foot pursuit where he worked the vehicle off the shoulder of the roadway, to avoid a train near the bottom of Brush Creek Hill.

The Corvette had reportedly been stolen on Wednesday, July 16th in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Four chosen for Girls in Science Program

Katherine (Katie) Murgan, Morgan Collins, Megan Mazurek and Rachel Woodall have all been chosen for an innovative program offered by the University of Kentucky, designed to encourage girls from Appalachia to pursue careers in the sciences.

Girls in Science, an educational initiative sponsored by the Department of Behavioral Science, University of Kentucky-College of Medicine, nurtures girls' interests in science, technology, engineering and math. The two-year program includes five Saturday academies throughout the school year at participants' local community colleges. The girls also will receive mentoring from women who are succeeding in science-based careers.

The four are part of 60 seventh-grade girls who began the program this summer. The girls stayed at UK for a week-long summer camp in June.

Each participant will be given a \$100 stipend upon completion of each summer session and a \$1,000 stipend upon completion of the two-year program to be used for the college of her choice.

Teachers and parents are also involved in this effort. Participating teachers will attend two-day summer workshops at UK to help create Girls in Science clubs in their local schools. Parents will be offered workshops on issues such as gender stereotyping and ways to encourage their daughters' interests in science, math, engineering and technology.

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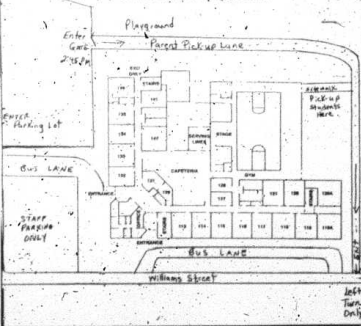

MVES Parent Pick-up Procedure

The procedure for dismissing parent pick-ups at Mt. Vernon Elementary School for 2003-2004 school year has been changed. Parent pick-ups are those students whose parents/guardians drive to the school each day to pick them up in the afternoon. Parents will no longer be waiting in the cafeteria to receive their children. It may take a few days to get the routine established and will therefore require everyone's full cooperation. Please following the guidelines for dismissal:

1. Students will be assigned a number at the beginning of the school year. Parents/guardians will be given the same number to be displayed in the rearview mirror of the vehicle.
2. Parents/guardians will enter the parking lot from School St. and line up in the Parent Pick-up lane. The gate to the pick-up lane will remain locked until 2:45 p.m. Parents do not need to enter the campus prior to 2:45 p.m. unless picking up students for early appointments.
3. Cars will drive in a double lane until they reach the curve. Drivers will then be directed to proceed in single car order to the sidewalk where students will enter the vehicle.
4. Drivers must remain in cars in pick-up lane. No parking in pick-up lane. Staff members will identify parent/guardian by number and students will be sent directly to the vehicle from the gym. Walkers and pick-ups will be dismissed at 3:50 p.m.
5. Drivers will be making a left turn only onto Williams St. from the pick-up lane.
