As a condition of eligibility for re-ceiving price support, all pesticide products (including plant regulators, defoliants and désiceants) used in connection with the production of Burley tobacco, must be approved by the Environmential Protection Agency (EPA) for use on tobacco and that such pesticide products must be applied in accordance with label di-rections.

The warehouse number will be indicated with a number on the marketing card. Therefore, if a producer decides to market at a warehouse other than the one specified on the card. The producer must return the card to the FSA office in a specific time period to request another marketing early.

Action to withhold price support on tobacco treated with nonapproved EPA pesticides or when pesticides are not used in accordance with Label directions was made necessary because their use threatens the domestic and export markets for tobacco. Samples of tobacco crops will be taken and chemically analyzed to determine whether nonapproved pesticides were not applied in accordance with label directions. A "No Frice Support" marketing varid will be issued for the farm when the analysis indicates nonapproved pestigies used for the farm when the analysis indicates nonapproved pestigies.

As a condition of price support of burley tobacco producers are re-quired to inform FSA of the war-house where they will market to-bacco. This is acquired by complet-ing the form FSA-808. Warehouse Designation, to indicate where the tobacco will be sold initial designa-tion will end August 1st. After the initial designation pe-

Disaster Leasing

the measurement fee will be refunded to the producer.

Remember, if you are a producer whose tokeco is suffering from poor weather conditions, black shank, blue mold, root disease, etc. come to the FSA office and file under the disaster provisions. PRIOR, TO, HAR-VEST.
