Notification of FERPA Rights

Distribute this notice annually to parents and students.

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and "eligible students" (students over 18 years of age or students who are attending a postsecondary institution) certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within forty-five (45) days of the day the District receives a request for access.

Parents or eligible students should submit to the school Principal/designee a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The Principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the record(s) may

The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent
or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of the student's

Parents or eligible students may ask the District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of privacy or other rights. They should write the school Principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of their privacy or other rights.

If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise himber of the right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure

One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A "school official" is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel;) a person serving on the school Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his/her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his/her professional responsibility. Upon request, the District shall disclose education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll or to other entities

4) The right to prohibit the discloture of personally identifiable information concerning the student to recruiting representatives of the U.S. Armed Forces and its service academies, the Kentucky Air National Guard, and the Kentucky Army National Guard. Unless the parent or eligible student requests in writing that the District not Yelease information, the student's name, address, and telephone number (if listed) shall be released to Armed Forces recruiters upon their request.

The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is:

Child Find for Children with Disabilities in Need of Special Education or 504 Services

__School District keeps educational records in a secure location in each school and

The <u>Rockcastle County</u> School District obtains written consent from a parent or eligible student (age 18 or who is attending a postsecondary institution), before disclosing personally identifiable information to an entity or individual not authorized to receive item (FERPA.

For students who have been determined eligible for Special Education, educational records will be destroyed at the request of the parents when they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. The <u>Rockessile County</u> School District may destroy the educational records of a child without parent request <u>event</u> years after they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. Parents are advised that data contained in the records may later be needed for Social Security benefits or other purposes. The <u>Rockessile County</u> School District may retain, for an indefinite period of time, a record of the students name, address, telephone number, grades, attendance records, classes attended, grade level completed, and year romenlated.

uldren eligible for Special-Education include those children with disabilities who have autism, deaf-radiness, developmental delay, emotional-behavior disability, hearing impairment, mental disability, stalliple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other fealth impairment, specific learning disability, spech or guage impairment, traumatic brain injury, or visual impairment and who because of such an impairment of Special-Education services.

Children eligible for 304 services include those children who have a turrent physical or mental, impairment that currently substantially limits some major-life activity which causes the student's ability fo access the shool environment or shool activities to be substantially limited.

Rockeastle County School District has an ongoing "Child Find" system, which is designed to identify and evaluate any child residing in a home, facility, or residence, within its geographical fasters, age three (3) to twenty-one (21) years, who may have a disability and be in need of Special totton or 504 services. This includes children who are not in school; those who are in public, private, or school; those who are highly mobile such as children who are migrant or homeless, and, thisse who are cing from grade to grade, who may need but are not receiving Special Eduquition or 504 services.

The <u>Rockessile County</u> School District will make sure any child enrolled in its district who qualifies for Special Education or 504 services, regardless of how severe the disability, is provided appropriate Special Education or 504 services at no cost to the parents of the child.

arents, relatives, public and private agency employees, and concerned citizens are urged to help the ocicastle County School District flad any child who may have a disability and need Special Education or 504 hereign. The District needs to know the name and age of date of birth of the child; the name, address, and hone number(s) of the parents or guardiant the possible disability, and other information to determine if pecial Education or 504 services are needed.

Letters and phone calls are some of the ways the <u>Rockestle County</u> Scheel Platrict collects the information needed. The information the school District collects will be used to contact the parents of the child and find out if the child need to be evaluated or reterred for Special Education of 503 services.

"Child Find" activities will continue throughout the school year. As part of these efforts the <u>Rockcastil County</u> School District will use screening information, student records, and basic assessment information it collects on all children in the <u>District</u> to help locate those children who have a disability and need Special Education or 504 services. Any information the District collects through "Child Find" is maintained confidentially.
