in the murder case involving Davy
Stewart, 35, of Orlando in the death
of Patty Gail Clark, who was 25-years-old at

According to 'police reports, According to 'police reports, Clair had been reported missing on August 13th of that year and-was last seen alive four days, earlier.
Police were led to her badly decomposed body by Sally Hoskins, now 27, of Crooked Creek, who told police that Clark had been shot to death by Stewart.
Clark's body was found in a wooded area, off a logging road in Cove Branch area, near McNew Cemetery, where police had found an abandoned Jeepth ed day after Clark was reported missing.
Hoskins told-police that she, Stewart and Clark were all sitting in the Jeep at the McNew Cemetery when Stewart shot her (Hoskins) after an argument.

Police sag-that Stewart then took the two women, both of whom he sad either dated or was during at the time, into the woods where he told them to pray for their souls.

Four sentenced in Circuit Court

Eddy F Montgomery, Commonwealth's Attorney for Rockcastle, Lincoln and Pulask, Codinities, announced today that one person entered a plea of guilty and four people were sentenced to prison in Rockcastle County Circuit Court. According to Montgomery, An-gela Miller, 24, of Mt. Vermon was sentenced to one year improsonous

sentenced to one year imprisonment for escape, second degree.

Keesha Saylor, 24, of Crab Or-chard, received a five year sentence for burglary, second degree. Walter, Price, 51; of Mr. Vernon, was sentenced to ten years for manu-facture of methamphetamine and possession of a controlled substance. possession of

Mignon Looney, 21, of Brodhead, pleaded guilty to burglary, third degree and Montgomery has recommended a sentence of four year's imprisonment. Sentencing is scheduled for September 78, 2003.

Also sentenced was John Campbell, 42, of Georgetown, to one year's imprisonment for operating a motor which under the influence of aladhol, fourth offense.
