Farm Storage Facility Loans
The FSA office has Farm Storage

Facility Loans available to producers who have a need for increased storage. In order to be eligible, m a storage. In order to be engine, in a producer must have a satisfactory credit history, have no delinquent federal debt, be a producer of facil-ity loan commodities such as corn, ity loan commodities such as corn, soybeans or wheat, demonstrate the ability to repay the debt and be in compliance with USDA provisions for highly erodible land and wet-

lands.

Farm Changes
Producers who have purchased or sold land should inform the FSA office of the chaine. A copy of the deed or land contract sales is required to update FSA records with correct ownership. Producers are also reminded to inform the FSA office of any change of address.

Disaster Leasing
Farmers who suffer a burley tobacco disaster loss must file a report with FSA prior to harvest to
retain eligibility to lease provisions.
The disaster lease provision was
sented to provide relief to

producers that suffer a disaster loss and are unable to produce and market the farm's effective quota. To be eligible to lisaster lease and transfer, or the consideration of the
