## Gillum announces new drug court for Rockcastle and Pulaski

Circuit Judge Robert E. Gillum has amounced the establishment of a Drug Court Program to enable Pulaski and Rockeastle. Counties to participate in the 1.1 million dollars. appropriated by Congress for the establishment of drug courts in the 5th Congressional District. Judge Gillum and Judge William T. Phase One is a stabilizing period, taking 4 to 6 weeks, to make sure the participants are drug free and at least drug free for 30 days before elevat-ing to the next phase. During phase one, there will be counseling, three majdom drug sacrens per week, and one court appearance per week. Phase Two is an educational pe-riod, lasting for approximately eight mortiss. During this period of time, participants, will have court appea-nances at least once a week and two random drug screens per week.

Phase-three will last approxi-mately three moths and ba, a self-motivation period. During this parties motivation period. During this parties drug seren per week and no court appearance every three wieks. In all of the phases, there will be counseling and participants will have to maintain employment or conti-ued education. They will have to

maintain a stable home life and will have to cottinue any and all child support obligations.

If a party successfully completes the program by maintaining a digree and crime free life during this outire program, their charges with, their charges with dismissed if they are in a pre-trial diversion program or they will be conditionally discharged if on probation.

The end result of the program is a better society at a reduced cost to the taxpaying public.


