Department for Public Health urges people to get Flu Shots

Kentucky's flu season is under-way, with the state Public Health Laboratory confirming the first two positive influenza cultures yesterday.

Laboratory confirming the first two positive influenza cultures yesterday. Last year, the first flu case wasn't confirmed until-the Janiary. The Department for Public Health reported the results to the Centers for Dieseas Control and Prevention (CDC), which has warned that the flu season may be more severe this year due to the early circulation of a group of influenza viruses that has in previous years' caused a lot of people to become iff and to Jewcelp complications. The disease kills an average of 36,000 Americans every year.

36,000 Americans every year Public Health Commission Public Health Commissioner Dr. Rice Leach trages physicians, hospitals; public health departments, and others sponsoring influenza immunications to a special effort to see that Kentucky's senior critaren and other persons at high-risk of complication from influenza get protected against file.
