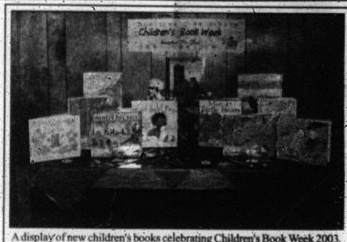
This past week November 17th-22nd was also Children's Book Week. In celebration of the week the Rockcastle County Library hosted a Storybook Chautauqua presentation
