The suit sitems from an incident on November 11th of, this year and alleges that Thacker "wrongfully and unlawfully, stopped at gan polyped at gan p tiff." suit also alleges that, after stopping Falin's vehicle, Thacker ordered Falin, at gun point, to exit the vehicle and lie face down with his arms outstretched to each side of the randway and then committed a battery against Falin by "kicking the, plaintiff in the face and head and stomping the plaintiff in the face and head and stomping the plaintiff in the neck and back."

Count three of the suit says that Court three of the suit says that Thacker "committed the intentional infliction of emotional distress against the plaintiff by stopping the plaintiff seeming, by kill the plaintiff and subsequently placing the plaintiff on subsequently placing the plaintiff on the ground and injuring the plaintiff by kicking and storoping hims."

Coffey said the suit will be filed over an alleged incident, earlier this year, in which Thacker, while on duty-and in front of witnesses, beat Mink excessively during an arrest
