Layers within the earth's atmosphere

Sometimes looking at the sky, especially when storm clouds tower high into the atmosphere, we tend to think that the sky goes forever. But, such is not the case. The "sky that contains our clouds, weather, and even color, is a very small layer indeed - especially when the vastness of space is considered. This envelope of gase is considered. This envelope of gas surrounding the Earth changes from the ground up. Four distinct layers have been identified using thermal characteristics (temperature changes), chemical composition, movement, and density.

The atmosphere is a cloud of gas and suspended solids extending from the Earth's surface our many thous

The Triposphere begins at the Earth's surface and extends up to about 14 miles high. This is where we live, and all air travel takes place. As you climb higher inthis layer is the temperature drops from about 62°C to 60°F. Almost all weather opens in this region, as this is the layer than most of the water vapor is found. The troposphere is normally warmest at ground level and cools higher up where it reaches its upper boundary, called the tropopause. The amospheric gasses are the most numerous, and the most dense within this layer.

The height of the tropopause varies from the equator to the poles. At the equator it is around 11 miles high, at 50°N and 50°S. 5I miles and at the poles just under four miles high. The tropopause and the troposphere known as the lower atmosphere.

The Stratosphere. The Stratosphere extends from the tropopause up to its boundary (the Stratopause), about 31 miles above the Earth's surface. This layer holds 19 percent of the atmosphere's gases and, it contains little water vapor.

Compared to the troposphere, it is calm in this layer with movements of the gases slow.

Within the stratosphere is the corone layer, a band of corone gas that absorbs harmful ultraviolet rays of the sun. The higher you get in the atmosphere, the warmer the air gets. The temperature rises from '76°F at the bottom to a maximum of about 5°F at the stratopause due to the absorption of ultraviolet radiation.

The Mesosphere:
The Mesosphere:
The Mesosphere is the next layer above the stratopause and extends to fits upper boundary (the Mesosphuse), at 50 miles above the ground. The gases in the mesosphere are too thin to absorb much of the surjs heat, affecting the stratogeness in the mesosphere are too thin to absorb much of the surjs heat, affecting fiery irails in the night sty.

The Thermosphere:

Because of this, the tempera-tures rise to 3,600°F at the top of this layer. This is at a height of about 430 miles above the earth's surface. This layer is known as the upper atmo-


