This is a great and blessed opportunity to view the beautiful Saltpetre Cave and recreation area. Be sure to bring a friend!

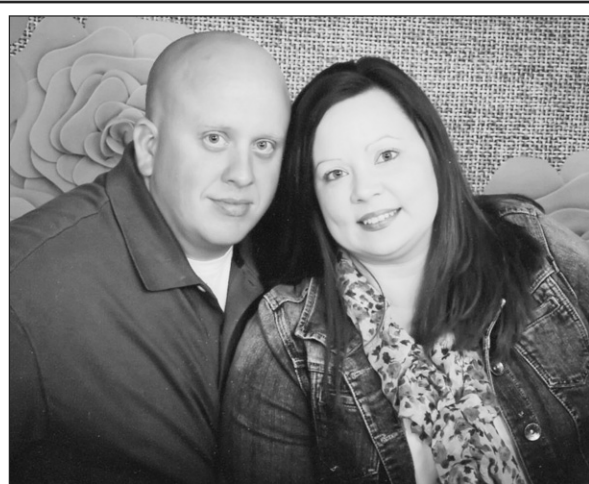

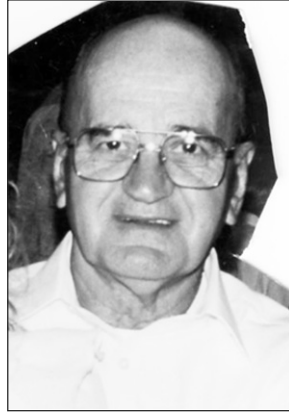
Jesse and Tiffany Bugg of Mt. Vernon announce the birth of their son, Jasse Avery Carroll Bugg on January 15, 2013.
