

A semi-truck hauling a forklift caught on fire Wednesday morning near Kentucky Fried Chicken on Richmond Street in Mt. Vernon. Authorities say Cumberland Machinery Movers driver David Bennett was traveling north on Richmond Street when he pulled over after noticing his trailer wheels were on fire. Mt. Vernon Fire and Rescue was able to extinguish the fire before it caused severe damage to the semi-truck or the forklift. No one was injured.

Peters spoke with the boy's mother Jessica Sizemore, who told Peters that she, Whitis and her three children lived in the basement of her parent's home in Mt. Vernon. She said Whitis is the father of Sizemore's youngest child but that her other two children also call him "daddy."

Sizemore told Peters that while she was at work, her mother had noticed a large bruise on her son's forehead after Whitis brought the three children upstairs from the basement.

When Whitis returned to the basement, Sizemore's mother asked what happened and Sizemore's sixyear-old daughter said "daddy was hitting his head against the wall because he won't tell the truth."

When Sizemore returned home from work, she asked her son if her daughter's allegations were true and he said Whitis had hit his head against the wall and also gave him a spanking.

Whitis initially denied any physical contact but eventually admitted to Sizemore that he did spank the child with a belt.

At this time, Sizemore told Peters that she asked Whitis to leave the residence and he did. Shortly after asking Whitis to leave, Sizemore took her son to Rockcastle Regional Hospital to have his injuries evaluated.

After receiving consent to search the vehicle, Adams found a zip-lock bag containing seven and one-half Hydrocodone pills. Adams also found a small metal canister containing four pieces of Hydrocodone tablets and a short piece of a drinking straw.

Adams discovered a text message on Lovell's cell phone from someone asking him for "30's", reportedly meaning Oxycodone 30 mg.

Lovell was arrested for drug paraphernalia and trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree. He was lodged in the Rockcastle County Detention Center and later released on a \$5,000 unsecured bond.


