Lady Rockets are 3-3 with back-to-back wins

The Lady Rockets pulled even in their season record Tuesday night with a win, their second in two nights, over the Lady Lions from Garrard County. On Monday night, the Rockets defeated Estill County.

The Rockets played three games in five days, beginning with the Somerset Briarjumpers last Friday night, their only loss in the three outings.

Against Somerset, freshman Hope Kelley came off the bench to score half of the Rockets first quarter 12 points. She also sank a half court three pointer at the end of the first half.

Junior Alaina Coguer, after going scoreless the first half, came through with a game high 18 points in the second half, going 8 for 8 from the free throw line, sinking two three point baskets and another two pointer.

The Rockets were down 19-12 at the end of the first quarter, 30-23 at the half and had pulled to within three at the end of the third quarter 42-39. However, they fell short in their comeback in the fourth, when Somerset outscored them 21-17, for the final 63-56.

Besides Coguer's 18, Kelley added 7 points in the second half for 16, Amelia Eversole got 10, Kayla Reynolds 6, Morgan Renner 4 and Ashley McKinney 2. **Against Estill**, the Lady Engineers made 13 of their 18 free throw attempts in the first half, against 5 by the Rockets, to help their 23-20 half time lead. The Rockets were still down 44-40 at the end of the third but with a strong third quarter by Coguer and Eversole and some deadeye free throw shooting at the end by Reynolds, the Rockets pulled out the 62-53 win.

Coguer again led the scoring with 20, Reynolds got 12, Eversole, Brianna Hansel and Mary Saylor had 8 each and McKinney and Jayna Albright each scored two.

Against Garrard County, the Lady Rockets were down 13-10 at the first quarter stop and the score was tied 24 all at half-time.

However, the Rockets got their act together in the third, outscoring the Lady Lions 15-4 and coasting to the 49-34 win.

Coguer was high pooint girl with 15, Eversole got 10, Mary Saylor had 8, Hansel 6, Renner 4 and Reynolds 2.

The girls will travel to Adair County Friday night for a doubleheader with the boys team. The girls will play Cumberland County at Glasgow Saturday at 12:30 and then will travel to Bourbon County for their Holiday Tournament where they will play Nicholas Co. on Dec. 27th at 9 a.m.


The Rockets were once
