•Increasing the amount of humidity in your home and/or office.

•Blinking more frequently. •Drinking plenty of wa-

If these tips don't offer any relief, the KOA recommends scheduling an appointment with an eye doctor to discuss prescriptionbased alternatives.

"Dry eye can't be cured, but the use of artificial tears or tear substitutes can be used," Burchett said. "For more severe cases, ointments can be used at bedtime, or small plugs may be inserted in the eyes' tear drainage canals to slow the loss of tears. In addition, nutritional substitutes may be recommended, and prescription medicine may be given to reduce inflammation and improve the pro-
